





Creating a Conducive Environment for Private Sector Investment Some Private Sector Concerns

- Lack of understanding of business principles or processes
- Lack of business friendly by-laws
- Lack of enforcement of the regulations
- Failure to maintain the existing facilities and infrastructure
- Administrative red tape (ineffective billing processes and long turn around processes)
- Unintended consequences of legislation
- Impact of all spheres of government on the tourism industry
