

# CHANGES IN THE EDUCATION LANDSCAPE FOR TOURIST GUIDES

**20 FEBRUARY 2014** 

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### BACKGROUND

- The National Qualifications Framework Act, 2008 (Act 67 of 2008) established the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) with three distinctive sub-frameworks that together functions as a single integrated system.
- These sub-frameworks are:
  - General and Further Education and Training
  - Higher Education and
  - Trades and Occupations.
- QCTO listed as Public Entity in Gov. Gazette No 33900 of 31 December 2010 effective from 1 April 2010 and must establish the Sub-framework for Trades and Occupations.
- The QCTO is responsible for the development, maintenance and quality assurance of occupational qualifications within its sub-framework.

#### QCTO MANDATE FROM SDA

- 'the QCTO is responsible for
  - establishing and maintaining occupational standards and qualifications'
  - 'the quality assurance of occupational standards and qualifications and learning in and for the workplace'
  - Designing and developing occupational standards and qualifications and submitting them to the SAQA for registration on the NQF
  - Ensuring the quality of occupational standards and qualifications and learning in and for the workplace;


QUALIFICATION?

The term 'occupational qualification' is defined in the SDA as:

'a qualification associated with a trade, occupation or profession, resulting from work-based learning and consisting of knowledge unit standards, practical unit standards and work experience unit standards'. All occupational qualifications are assessed externally through a nationally standardised integrated summative assessment.

WHAT IS AN OCCUPATIONAL

- The purpose of an occupational qualification is to
  - qualify a learner to practice an occupation that is reflected on the Organising Framework for Occupations (OFO) or an occupational specialisation related to an occupation that is reflected on the OFO.
