Requirements:

- Matric/Grade 12/NCV Level 4
- Relevant environmental field related National Diploma would be advantageous
- Aged between 18 - 35 years
- Language proficiency in English and any other local language.
- Preference will be given to applicants of local communities
- Clear criminal record.
- Computer Competency (MS Word, Excel and PowerPoint)
- Computer literacy levels (MS Word, Excel) will be tested where applicable
- Passing of fitness trial which includes (dependent on the deployment activities):
 - 2,4 km run in 12 minutes or less
 - Ability to do 30 pushups and 30 sit-ups in under a minute
 - Successful candidates are then granted an interview
- Successfully candidate will have to undergo medical fitness, polygraph (where applicable) through a Medical Practitioner.
- Availability to work flexible hours e.g. weekends, public holidays as and when required

Responsibilities:
