147. THE MINISTER OF TOURISM ANSWERS:

 (a) The contribution of tourism to job creation is measured through the Tourism Satellite Account (TSA) officially developed by Statistics South Africa (StatsSA) and it is monitored on an annual basis. The Tourism Satellite Account: Recommended Methodological Framework (TSA: RMF) developed by the World Tourism Organization was used by StatsSA as a guideline in NATIONAL ASSEMBLY developing the TSA for South Africa. The TSA: RMF is data intensive and the number of tourists alone could not be used to measure the contribution of tourism to jobs creation. There is a need to understand amongst others the expenditure of these tourists by products such as accommodation, transport, sports and recreational services, etc. Most of the information required for the TSA is not available quarterly, some even annually, reason why there is also a lag in the release of the annual TSA. However, the latest available statistics are for 2010 which indicate a growth of 4.3% from 2009 at total direct jobs in the sector amounting to 567 378.

- (b) (i) Small, medium and micro enterprises (SMMEs) benefitted through mentorship, market access and training in the first quarter.
 (ii) The SMMEs that benefited in the first quarter through our partnership with TEP, are 50 enterprises supported through mentorship. 90 enterprises supported with market access. 225 enterprises trained and 1000 FTE jobs supported through enterprise partnerships.
- (c) 129 rural enterprises supported in the first quarter.
