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### I. CONTEXT FOR REVISION OF PLANS

- Covid 19 has transformed the global landscape.
- All sectors have been impacted but none more than the travel and tourism sector.
- With borders being closed, planes and mass transport being grounded and large gatherings being prohibited there is almost zero activity in the sector.
- The tourism sector has in the past demonstrated strong resilience and will certainly be transformed and rise again.
- Early indications are that recovery of the sector may take between 12 and 24 months.
- There are high degrees of uncertainty both with regards to the pandemic and about the future of the sector, the planning context of the public sector will accordingly have to be adjusted.

# ESTIMATED GLOBAL IMPACT OF COVID-19 (UNWTO)

- Decline of 290 to 440 million International Tourist Arrivals
- 5 to 7 years lost in numbers of tourists
- Decline of 300 to 450 US\$ billion in Tourism Exports (receipts)
- I/3 of I.5 US\$ trillion lost in Tourism Exports




### 2. BACKGROUND

- The impact of COVID-19 on the tourism sector has necessitated a review of the Departmental Plans with due consideration of the emerging risks in the organisational performance management environment due to the pandemic.
- The review of the plans has taken into account the impact of the national lockdown, associated restrictions and high levels of uncertainty on the practical execution of some of our projects planned for 2020/21.
- With restrictions placed on travel and the phased opening of economic activities
  Departmental projects planned for 2020/21 that require site visits, construction,
  exhibitions, contact training and placement with host employers were anticipated to
  be especially affected. These projects relate mainly to the Expanded Public Works
  and Tourism Incentives Programmes.
- International and domestic marketing, exhibitions and events i.e. the work of the entity, South African Tourism, is equally affected.
- As the country tried to come to terms with the impact of the pandemic, work commenced on a Tourism Recovery Plan.
- As the country reprioritises resources to fight the pandemic, it was anticipated that
  the portfolio budget would be impacted, and the extent of which would only be
  confirmed during the adjustment budget.



#### 3. 'LOCAL FIRST' RECOVERY

Tourism recovery will experience a number of phases, from hyper-local community attractions, through broader domestic tourism, regional land and air markets, and lastly resumption of world-wide international travel. The phases may not necessarily follow the same sequence but of certain is domestic tourism first.

# 6. Capability of the Allocated Budget in Mitigating the Effects of COVID-19 to the Tourism Industry

- The current reprioritization is aimed at supporting the efforts to fight the pandemic. This is based on the understanding that limited marketing and promotional activities can take place in the current environment and most activities will be planning related and no activations.
- The EPWP funding will amongst others assist with upkeep of the tourism asset base within government to the extent possible as part of the broader sector recovery plan.
- The Department will continue to monitor the environment with National Treasury Upon readiness of the sector based on the Risk Adjusted Approach, the department shall motivate to the National Treasury to consider resourcing tourism's recovery efforts from a marketing and development point of view.
