Mrs F Mahomed (ANC) to ask the Minister of Tourism:

- (1) What specific steps has his department taken to exploit the opportunities brought about by the BRICS economic grouping to promote South Africa as a destination to a number of emerging markets that are experiencing relatively high growth;
- (2) (a) how has local tourism been benefiting from this and (b) what are the benefits;
- (3) whether he has found an increase in direct travel from these countries to South Africa; if so, what are the relevant details? NW3643E

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM REPLIES:

- (1) The Department has signed bilateral agreements on Tourism with Russia (in 1998), India (1997) and China in October this year. An agreement is currently being negotiated with Brazil and it is envisaged that it will be signed in the next financial year.
- (2) (a) South African Tourism's departure survey results indicate that the average spend per person coming into South Africa from the BRICS countries increased by 1.4% for the period 2010 to 2012.
 - (b) In 2012 the benefits of this kind of exposure also contributed to the increase of our overall brand awareness score from 13% at the beginning of 2012 to 16% at the beginning of 2013.
