
SUMMARY ANALYSIS OF SOUTH AFRICA'S TOURIST ARRIVALS FOR AUGUST 2022

To limit the spread of COVID-19 and prepare the health care sector, the South African government announced a national lockdown for the country starting on 27 April 2020, which prevented the movement of people entering and leaving South Africa. International tourists were not allowed to enter South Africa during the months of April-September 2020. On the 05th of April 2022, the National State of Disaster was lifted and most of the government COVID-19 regulations were removed including travel regulations to South Africa. Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) has published data on the number of tourists for August 2022 and this report provides further analysis of the tourists that travelled to South Africa during this period. The performance of tourism-related industries namely; accommodation, food and beverages, and aviation for August 2022 compared to August 2021 is also provided in this report.

TREND ANALYSIS: AUGUST 2017 – AUGUST 2022

A total of 555 832 tourist arrivals was recorded in August 2022, which was an increase of 199,4% (370 195) compared to the same month in 2021. Figure 1 below indicates tourist arrivals for the period August 2017 to August 2022. Tourist arrivals increased from 852 339 in 2017 to 876 926 in 2018, which was a growth of 2,9% (24 587). Tourist arrivals further increased from 876 926 in 2018 to 896 978 in 2019, which was an increase of 2,3% (20 052). There were zero tourists recorded during August 2020 since the country was under lockdown level 4 which prevented tourists from entering the country.

AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021 BY REGION

Table 1 below indicates tourist arrivals by region for August 2022 compared to the same month in 2021. All regions experienced a growth in tourist arrivals during this month compared to the same month of the previous year. Australasia recorded the highest increase of 2 154,0% (+5 622) followed by Europe (519,6%; +65 402) and Middle East (407,5%; +5 587). Africa also recorded an increase of 168,7% (+265 110) and this region remains the main source of tourist arrivals to the country, accounting for 76,0% (422 247) of total tourist arrivals during August 2022.

JANUARY-AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO JANUARY-AUGUST 2021

Tourist arrivals figures by region for the period January-August 2022 compared to the period January-August 2021 are indicated in table 2 below. Total tourist arrivals went up by 165,2% for the period January-August 2022 compared to the period January-August 2021. This was a growth from a total of 1 263 163 tourist arrivals recorded during January-August 2021 to 3 349 402 during the period January-August 2022. Total tourist arrivals from the overseas market increased by 419,9% (+664 396). Australasia (1 439,1%) recorded the highest positive growth followed by Europe (564,6%), Middle East (314,3%), North America (293,1%), Central and South America (257,1%) and Asia (182,3%).

In Australasia, Australia recorded the highest increase in volume having an increase of 25 184 (1 489,3%) followed by New Zealand (+4 614; 1 240,3%). The United Kingdom had recorded the highest increase in volume (+150 503; 1 115,0%) in the Europe region. In North America, the USA has recorded the highest increase in volume (+116 260; 275,2%). Israel had recorded the highest increase in volume for the Middle East region with an additional 8 488 tourists compared to January-August 2021. In Central and South America, Brazil recorded the highest increase in volume (+6 327, 265,1%) for the period under review.

Tourist arrivals from Africa increased by 128,6% (+1 418 428) during the same period under review. In terms of volume, the increase recorded from the continent was driven by Zimbabwe (+442 947; 179,4%) followed by Lesotho (+309 145; 145,0%) and Mozambique (+266 375; 84,6%), refer to table 2.1 below.

Table 2.1 below gives the rankings of the top ten African source markets for the period January-August 2022 compared to January-August 2021. Most of the top ten African source markets moved their positions except for Lesotho, Eswatini, Zambia and Malawi which ranked 3rd, 4th, 7th and 8th position during both periods. Zimbabwe, Botswana and Angola moved up their positions from 2nd to 1st, 6th to 5th and from 12th to 9th respectively in 2022 when compared to 2021. Angola replaced Nigeria in the top 10 during this period. All top ten countries recorded a positive growth with Angola recording the highest increase of 345,4% followed by Zimbabwe (179,4%) and Botswana (172,0%).

Table 2.2 shows the rankings of the top ten Overseas source markets. Comparing January-August 2022 with January-August 2021, all top 10 overseas markets recorded an increase in tourist arrivals. Most of the top ten overseas markets moved positions for the period under review except for Germany and France which ranked 3rd and 5th position during both periods. UK replaced the USA as the main source market from overseas, recording a growth of 1 115,0%. China, Pakistan

and Russian Federation were replaced by Australia, Belgium and Canada in the top 10 list during January-August 2022 compared to January-August 2021.

PERFORMANCE OF SOUTH AFRICA'S TOURISM-RELATED INDUSTRIES: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021

The next section of the report is about the performance of tourism-related industries during August 2022 compared to August 2021.

Impact of Coronavirus (COVID-19) on tourism-related industries' performance

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organisation (WHO) declared the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak a pandemic (WHO, 2020). To limit the spread of COVID-19, many countries had started to introduce lockdown measures, which prevented people from leaving their countries. On 1 May 2020, the South African government adopted the risk-adjusted strategy, which aimed to increase economic activity while putting measures in place to reduce the transmission of the virus. As part of this approach, five (5) Coronavirus alert levels were introduced, mainly indicating the different sectors that can operate under these levels. The national state of disaster was lifted as of 5 April 2022 which resulted in most of the COVID-19 regulations being removed. The table below provides a summary of the lockdown regulations of the different levels for the accommodation, food and beverage and aviation industries for August 2022 and August 2021. The performance of the tourism-related industries therefore should be viewed within the context of South Africa's COVID-19 lockdown regulations for the different lockdown restriction levels. 2.1 ACCOMMODATION INDUSTRY: AUGUST 2022

ACCOMMODATION INDUSTRY INCOME: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021 (CURRENT PRICES)

Table 4 below provides the total income from the accommodation industry which comprises of income from restaurants, bar sales, income from accommodation only and other income for August 2022 compared to August 2021. Other income includes income from casino gambling, laundry and telephone services, rentals and fees received for transport services, offices, shops, garages, etc. In August 2022, the total income (current prices) from the accommodation industry showed an increase of 55,4% compared to August 2021. Total income from all of the categories recorded an increase except for Caravans and camping sites which decreased by -20,2% when compared to 2021. Total income from Guest houses and guest farms recorded the highest increase of about 77,0% moving from R74,5 million in August 2021 to R131,9 million in August 2022.

Table 5 below indicates that income from accommodation (excluding restaurants, bar sales and other income) went up by 80,3% during August 2022. All categories of accommodation showed an increase in income levels except for Caravan parks and camping sites which decreased by -24,2% when compared to 2021. Total income from Hotels recorded the highest

increase of 118,0%; followed by Guest houses and guest farms (88,8%) and other accommodation (59,1%).

The monthly percentage change of income from the accommodation industry (excluding restaurants, bar sales and other income) for January-August for the period 2021-2022 is provided in table 6 below. Income from accommodation showed an increase of 80,3% during August 2022 when compared to the same month in 2021 and this was the second highest increase recorded compared to the previous months of the year as seen in table below.

ACCOMMODATION INDUSTRY OCCUPANCY RATE: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021

Table 7 below indicates occupancy rates by accommodation type for August 2022 compared to August 2021. The total accommodation occupancy rate in August 2022 was 35,1%, which was an increase compared to 22,9% recorded in August 2021. The occupancy rate for all of the accommodation establishments increased in August 2022 compared to the same month last year except for Caravan parks and camping sites which decreased from 39,6% in 2021 to 36,3% in 2022.

In addition to Stats SA's accommodation report, the Department also subscribes to STR Global, which collects information from hotels on a monthly basis. The performance of the South African hotel industry for August 2022 compared to August 2021 is provided in table 8 below. It is important to note that the STR hotel data information for August 2022 and August 2021 is from a sample of 322 hotels that are drawn from a census/population of 429 hotels.

There was an increase recorded in all hotel performance indicators in August 2022 compared to August 2021. Hotel occupancy rate increased by 66,7% in August 2022 compared to August 2021, moving from an occupancy rate of 31,8% in August 2021 to 53,0% in August 2022. The Average Daily Rate (ADR) for August 2022 was R1 219,77 which was an increase of 18,9% compared to R1 025,53 seen in August 2021. The Revenue Per available room also increased by 98,3%; from R325,84 in August 2021 compared to R646,17 in August 2022.

2.2 FOOD AND BEVERAGES INDUSTRY

FOOD AND BEVERAGES INDUSTRY INCOME: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021 AT CONSTANT 2019 PRICES (R MILLION)

The results in table 9 indicate that the total income (constant prices) for the food and beverages industry in August 2022 was about R5 584.0 million, which was an increase of 25,0% compared to R4 467.4 million in August 2021. All food and beverages industry categories showed an increase in income, with catering services having the highest increase of 43,9% followed by restaurants and coffee shops (29,6%) and take away and fast food with (13,3%).

Note: Food and beverages income at constant prices by type of enterprise and by type of income is estimated by deflating income at current prices using the relevant components of the consumer price index for restaurants.

The monthly percentage change of income from the food and beverages industry for August 2022 compared to August 2021 is provided in table 10 below. Income from the food and beverages industry recorded an increase of 25,0% during August 2022 compared to the same month in 2021. Comparing other months, the second highest increase has been recorded in August 2022 as seen in the table below.

2.3 AVIATION

PASSENGER ARRIVALS MOVEMENT: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021

Table 11 shows the total passenger arrivals at Airports Company South Africa (ACSA) airports during August 2022 compared to August 2021. Total passenger arrivals increased by 110,0%; from 586 947 in August 2021 to 1 232 833 in August 2022. International passengers showed the highest increase of 243,9 followed by regional (153,4%), domestic (82,3%) and unscheduled passengers (70,2%).

PASSENGER DEPARTURE MOVEMENT: AUGUST 2022 COMPARED TO AUGUST 2021

Table 12 provides the total passenger departing from Airports Company South Africa (ACSA) airports during August 2022 compared to August 2021. Total departing passengers increased by 112,2%; from 592 082 in August 2021 to 1 256 532 in August 2022. The table further indicates that international passengers departing had the highest increase of 250,2% followed by regional (160,2%), domestic (81,9%) and unscheduled passengers (61,0%).
