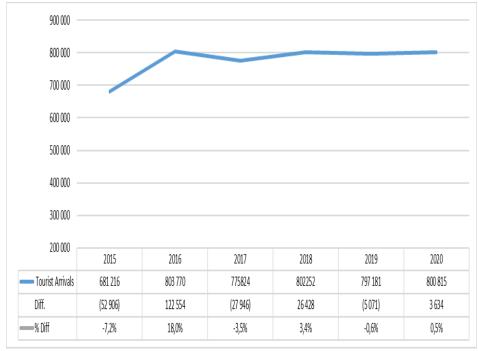
SUMMARY ANALYSIS OF TOURIST ARRIVALS: FEBRUARY 2020

TREND ANALYSIS: FEBRUARY 2015 - FEBRUARY 2020

A total of 800 815 tourist arrivals was recorded in February 2020, which was an increase of 0.5% (3 634) compared to the same month in 2019.

Figure 1 below indicates tourist arrivals for the period February 2015 to February 2020. Tourist arrivals increased from 681 216 in 2015 to 803 770 in 2016 which was an increase of 18.0% (122 554). Tourist arrivals decreased from 803 770 in 2016 to 775 824 in 2017, which was a decline of -3.5% (-27 946). Tourist arrivals increased by 3.4% (26 428) in February 2018 compared to the same month in 2017. Comparing February 2019 with February 2018, there was a decrease of -0.6% (-5 071) in tourist arrivals during this period.

FEBRUARY 2020 COMPARED TO FEBRUARY 2019 BY REGION

Table 1 indicates tourist arrivals by region for February 2020 compared to the same month in 2019. Australasia recorded the highest increase with a growth of 15.6%, followed by Central and South America (11.8%), North America (9.3%), Middle East (4.8%) and Europe with 2.9%. The increase recorded in Australasia was influenced by New Zealand having a growth of 84.7% (618) in tourist arrivals during this month. Asia is the only region which recorded a decline of -33.3% (-8 609) during this period. Africa recorded a slight increase of 0.4% (1 931) and this region remains the main source of tourist arrivals to the country, accounting for 68.9% (551 376) of total tourist arrivals during this month.

JANUARY-FEBRUARY 2020 COMPARED TO JANUARY-FEBRUARY 2019

Tourist arrivals figures by region for the period January-February 2020 compared to the same period in 2019 are indicated in Table 2 below. Total tourist arrivals (1 894 083) went up by 1.5% (28 712) for the period January to February 2020 compared the same period in 2019 (1 865 371). Total tourist arrivals from the overseas market increased by 2.4% (11 321). Middle East (24.5%) recorded the highest increase followed by Central and South America (8.1%), North America (7.1%), Australasia (5.1%) and Europe with an increase of 3.4%. Tourist arrivals from Asia went down by -16.1%. The highest declining growth recorded in Asia was from China with a decline of -39.7% (-7 119) followed by South Korea (-29,3%). As already indicated, Middle East recorded the highest growth in tourist arrivals during this period under review. With regards to volume, the growth from Middle East was driven by an increase of 1 857 tourist arrivals from Saudi Arabia (194,0%) moving from a total of 957 to 2 814 for the period under review. Tourist arrivals from Africa increased by 1.2% (17 228) during the same period under review. In terms of volume, the increase recorded from the continent was driven by an increase of 4.9% (15 014) from Lesotho, followed by Botswana (10 445/13%) and Eswatini (5 462/4,1%).

Table 3 gives the rankings of the top ten African source markets for the period January-February 2020 compared to January-February 2019. All of the top ten African source markets remained at the same position for the period under review. Most of the top ten countries recorded a decline except for Botswana (13.0%), Lesotho (4.9%), Eswatini (4.1%) and Malawi with 0.2%. Angola recorded the highest decline (-21,0%) followed by Nigeria (-19.3%) and Zambia (-7.3%).

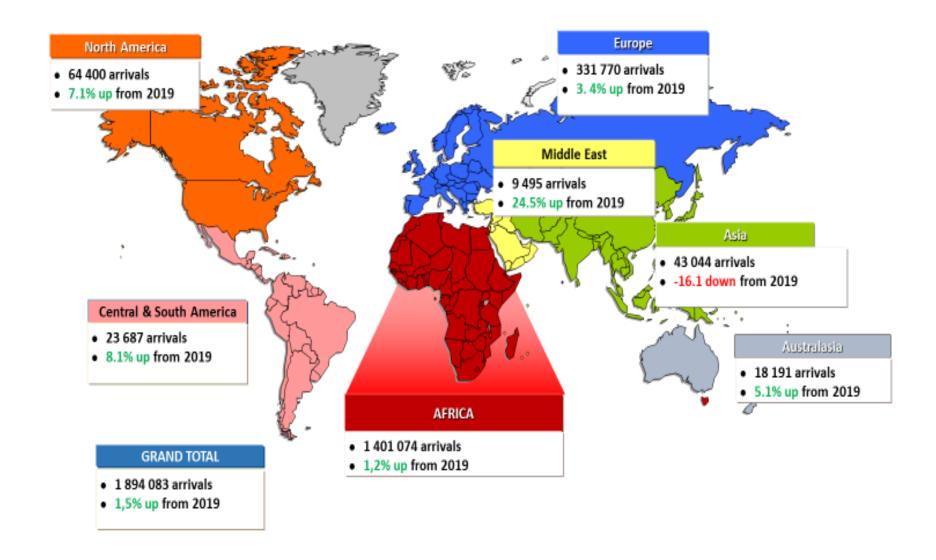

Table 4 shows the rankings of the top ten overseas source markets. Comparing January-February 2020 with January-February 2019, most of the top 10 overseas markets recorded an increase in tourist arrivals except for Sweden (-10.5%), France (-6.0%) and Australia with -1.9%. Despite this decline, most of the top ten overseas markets remained in the same position for the period under review except for Brazil moving up from 12th position in 2019 to 6th position in 2020 removing China from the top 10. Canada and Sweden exchanged position with Canada moving up from 10th position in 2019 to 9th position in 2020 while Sweden moved down from 9th position in 2019 to 10th position in 2020. UK remains the main source market from overseas recording a growth of 3.4%.

ANNEXURE 3: AVIATION AND HOTEL DATA

A. AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA (ACSA): PASSENGER AND AIRCRAFT MOVEMENT

International passenger movement in ACSA airports slightly went down by -0,3% for the period February 2020 compared to the same month in 2019. However international aircraft movement went up by 3, 9% during the same month. Regional passenger and aircraft movement recorded a decline during January and February 2020 compared to same months in 2019. It should be noted that South African Airways cancelled some of the routes due to the restructuring programme during this period.

B. ESTIMATES OF PASSENGER MOVEMENTS AND BOOKINGS FROM FORWARDKEYS

The Department of Tourism has subscribed with ForwardKeys to monitor bookings of air passengers in order to do a trend analysis of air arrivals to the country. Estimates does not include land markets and it should be noted that different trends might be observed from countries that a driven by land arrivals when actual tourist arrivals to the country are released by Statistics South Africa. The data analysed in this section aims to compare the trend for the period January to February 2020 as well as to provide trend analysis of growth expected for March 2020 compared to the same month in 2019. It should be noted that these figures are based on actual passengers that have already travelled in the previous months but for the coming months, the estimates are based on bookings at the time when the data was downloaded. Although this can be used for trend analysis, it should be noted that passengers per route does not necessarily mean that they are from the country of departure whereas actual tourist arrivals figures released by Statistics South Africa is based on the country of residence. This analysis is based on the data downloaded on 4 April 2020 and it should be noted that latest data could not be downloaded as the license has expired. The Department has a sub-license under SA Tourism's agreement and it is awaiting SA Tourism to renew the main license.

South Africa's Top Ten Overseas Markets by Forwardkeys Passenger Movement

Table 6 below indicates that some overseas markets have been recording a decline in passenger movement to the country since the beginning of 2020. Passengers from China recorded a decline of -5.9% in January 2020 and a decline of -81,2% and -94,4% for February 2020 and March 2020 respectively. All markets recorded a decline in passenger movement to the country during March 2020.

HOTEL PERFORMANCE: FEBRUARY 2020

The only latest official data available from Statistics South Africa on the performance of the accommodation industry is for January 2020. The analysis in this section will be based on the reports received from STR Global on estimates for the performance of the hotel industry which covers February and March 2020. According to STR, it is estimated that the occupancy rate for South African hotels went up by 1.8% moving from 66, 9% in 2019 to 68, 1% in 2020.

Data from STR Global also estimates that the hotel occupancy rate went down from 67,6% in March 2019 to 37,2% during the same month in 2020. Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) and Average Daily Rate (ADR) also went down during this period.
