


GLOBAL TOURISM PERFORMANCE

Comparing July-Sept 2017 to July-Sept 2016, there was an increase recorded in the key inbound tourism indicators as shown below.





GLOBAL TOURISM ECONOMIC PERORMANCE: 2016


In 2017, tourism's direct contribution to GDP was USD 2, 570,1 billion, 3.2% contribution to the total GDP in 2017.



Comparing 2016 to 2015, there was an increase recorded in the key domestic indicators as shown below. .





South Africa Tourism GDP and Employment Contribution: 2016 (Provisional)

In 2016, it was estimated that tourism's direct contribution to GDP was R125, 136 million, which was about 2.9% of the total GDP.
