Act No. 3 Tourism Act, 2014

To provide for the development and promotion of sustainable tourism for the benefit of the Republic, its residents and its visitors; to provide for the continued existence of the South African Tourism Board; to provide for the establishment of the Tourism Grading Council; to regulate the tourist guide profession; to repeal certain laws; and to provide for matters connected therewith.

“INDIGENOUS?”



- Roles and responsibilities uniquely compiled for a **“HERITAGE GUIDE”** - our Culture Guide
- When dealing with isolated communities (ISTs) more emphasis on tourist guide’s abilities to adhere to **heritage and cultural identities**
- Need to set the principle tourists need to follow in terms of **authenticity, cultural sensitivity and behavioural attributes**
- Unlike Adventure and Nature guide, the Heritage guide needs to balance between:

Experience
Resource management

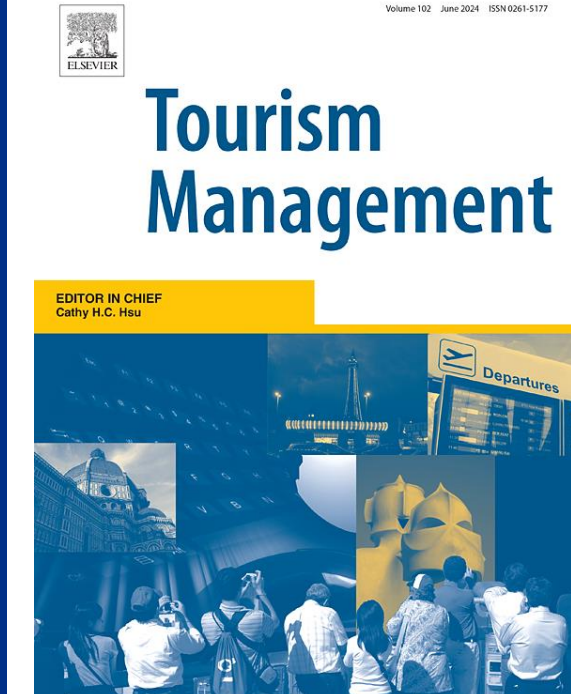
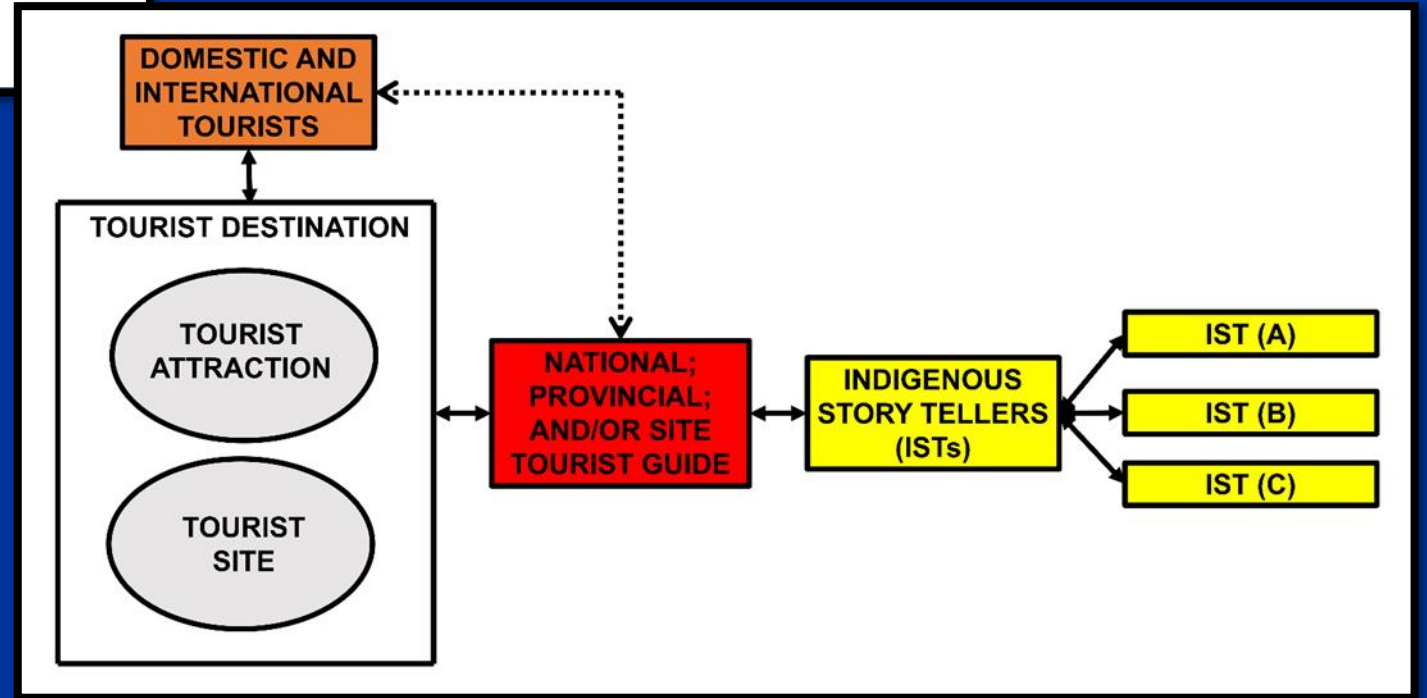
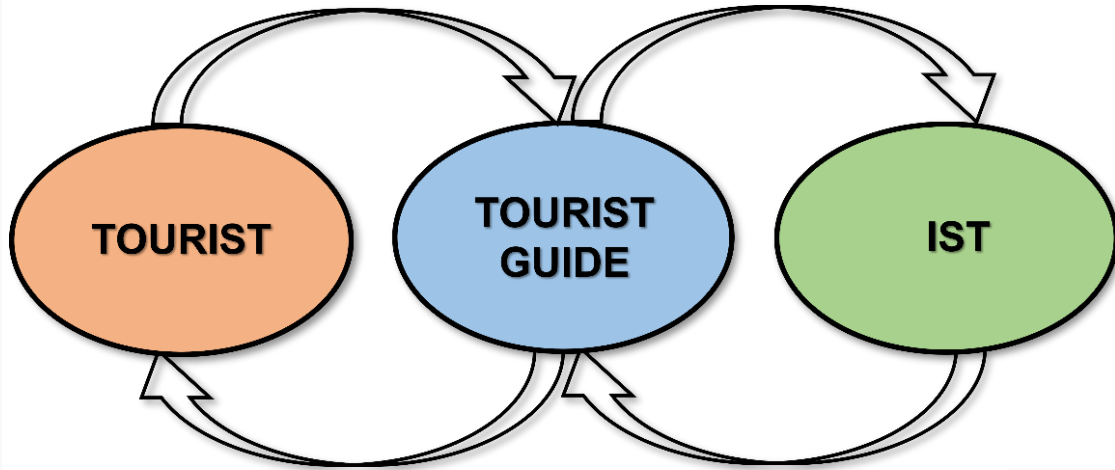


Figure 1: Integrating the IST into the tourism flow



Central concerns

- extend the tourism domain so as to be **more inclusive** of community members
- local voice, with inherent knowledge, could **enhance the authenticity** of the tourist experience
- contribute to the **transformation of the sector**
- encompass the inclusion of **indigenous knowledge** in the very broadest sense
- add to the **uniqueness and genuineness of the tourist's experience**

- not been fully explored **academically** or in practice
- develop a **strategy** for the inclusion of the IST within the tourist guiding domain
- Define a mechanism to **monitor** this within the established three-tiered hierarchy of tourist guides
- develop a **procedure** to incorporate these community voices into the tourist experience

This **proposed new unit standard** must include six components in order to prepare the **culture tourist guide** for the integration of the IST:

Requirements of the culture tourist guide

- Acquire a broad based historical overview of southern African history from precolonial to democracy so as to contextualise the specific IST within their historical domain
- Awareness of the cultural, sacred, spiritual realm from which the IST operates
- Preserve and conserve the cultural landscape for sustainability
- Determine and arrange the risk level of the space where the IST will engage with the tourists
- Competence in dealing with intercultural communication
- Facilitate and arbitrate a congenial atmosphere

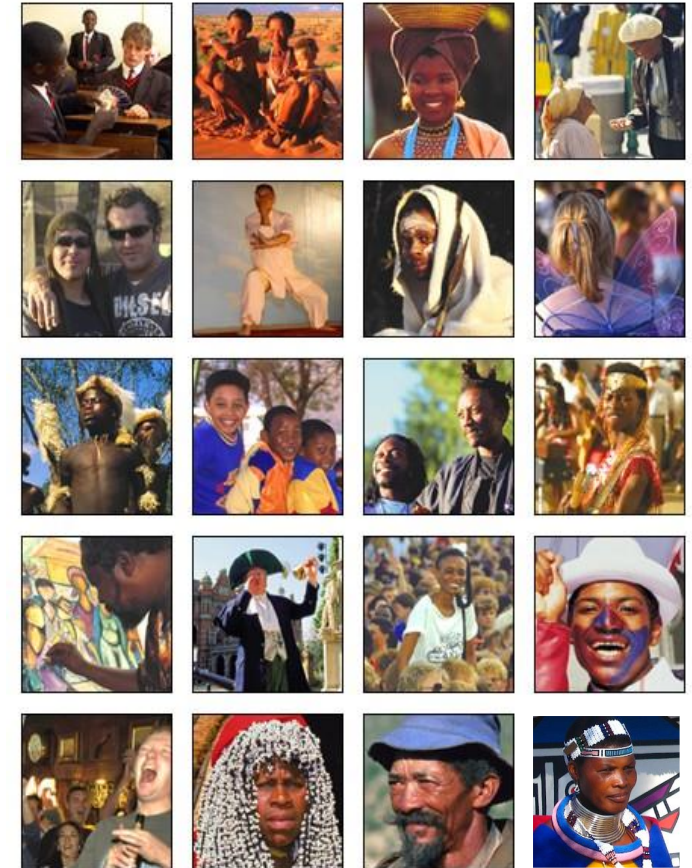

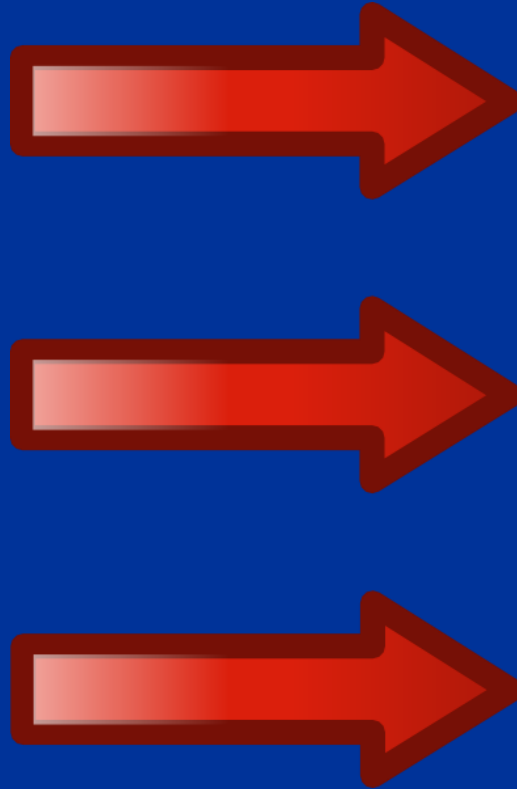
Facilitate the IST, Level 4, 10 Credits.

- Identify with an identifiable cultural group, community or tradition
- Have an authentic and viable story to share
- Story must not be harmful, disrespectful or offensive to anyone
- Be able to articulate in an accessible language
- Comply with the broader requirements of POPI

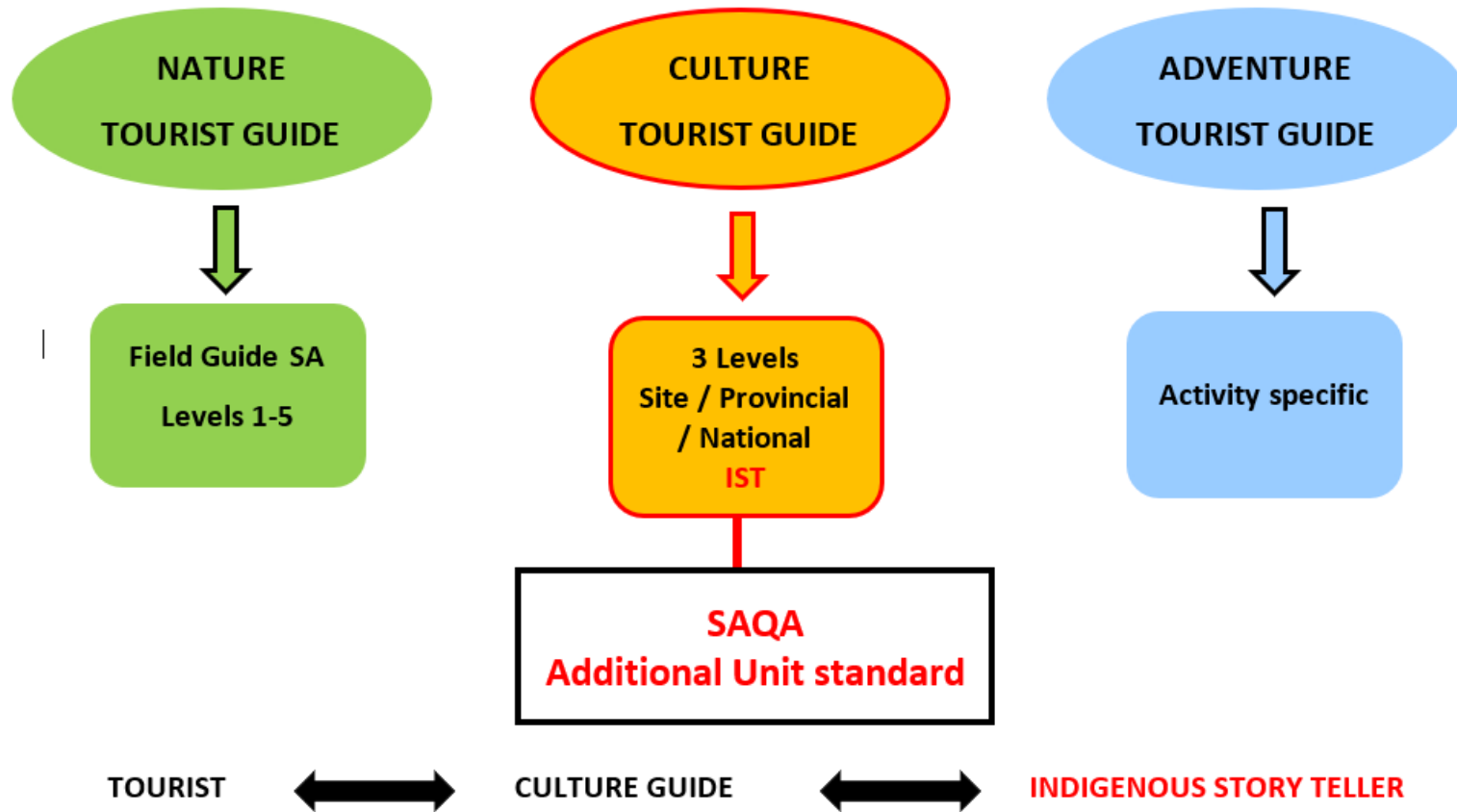
